Carnival Procession

The Procession will assemble in Moorhall Road, South Harefield.

Judging of the floats will take place before, during the procession, and at the Carnival site in the Hospital grounds.

The Procession will leave Moorhall Road at 12.30 p.m. and turn left into Harvil Road, up Church Hill, through the village, across the roundabout to the Hospital grounds, arriving at approximately 1.30 p.m.

The Carnival Queen will present the trophies.

Harefield Hospital has good reason to celebrate this Si Iver Jubilee Year. It is sixty years since the ANZAC hospital was established, fifty years since it was handed over to the Middlesex County Council for civilian use; and forty years ago the main building was opened by the late Duke of Gloucester.

Built for use as a sanatorium, the decrease in the incidence of tuberculosis and the 1939 war brought a change in the type of patient treated. In addition to patients with diseases of the chest, treated medically and surgically, a number of military and civilian casualties were nursed here during the war and afterwards the "temporary" wards built for that purpose were used for general medical and surgical cases, and geriatric patients.

Patients for lung and heart surgery come from a wide catchment area, and also from various centres in parts of the British Isles where there are inadequate local facilities to care for patients. We also get a number of patients from overseas. In such a place as Harefield it is difficult for relatives of some patients to visit on a daily basis, and some are found accommodation by the League of Friends and others by many local families who take them into their homes. This is a need which continues to present problems and more help would be welcome.

JEAN CHAPMAN. Jean will be taking part in the Carnival Procession, riding with her husband in their white Rolls Royce. Later in the afternoon (about 4 o'clock) she will be entertaining us with a "Wild West" act. Jean is an amazing lady, she holds the world record for fire-eating - 720 flaming torches in just two hours. As a child actress she appeared in many films - The Lavendar Hill Mob with Alec Guinness, The Extra Day with Beryl Reid and My Teenage Daughter with Sylvia Sims, etc. She went on to riding elephants in a circus, did chorus in pantomime and rope spinning. Her night club act was so successful that she was asked to spin guns as a "stand-in" for Emma Peel in The Avengers. She taught herself fire-eating. Went on tour in Germany. Has often appeared in children's TV programmes.

HIGHLAND BAND. Mr. Jock Reynolds teaches music to a night class at Samuel Pepys School in South East London. From the men and boys who attended his class, he has formed the Highland Band, the youngest member being only 9 years old. Whenever possible, they travel around the country playing for various charities. We are delighted to have them with us today leading the procession and playing during the afternoon.

STEEL BAND. The New Found Crusaders (who have appeared on TV) will be playing at approximately 3.30 p.m. for half an hour. Dancing to their music will be Sister Alexis and some of the nurses from the hospital. They will also be providing the music for the Carnival Dance.

BOYS FIVE-A-SIDE FOOTBALL. This event, organised by Mr. Colin Holmes, is for boys from four 4th year classes at Harefield Junior School. They compete each year for a cup. There will be two 1st round ties then a play-off for 3rd and 4th places, followed by the Final. The draw will be made prior to the start of the matches.

JUNIOR NETBALL. The Junior School Netball Team, selected from girls in the 4th year, have played in the Inter-Schools League and in two rallies with schools in the Borough. They play 9 matches in their league and so far have won 6 out of 7, with 77 goals for and 20 against. All

4th year girls are able to participate in the inter-class matches which are very popular. Our aim is to give the girls an introduction to the game of netball which they can continue in their Secondary Schools.

PUSH-BALL COMPETITION (Clubs and Pubs).

This exciting event is sponsored by the Ex-Servicemen's Club of Harefield to whom we are extremely grateful. The competition is between teams of eight, each team representing a Club or Public House in Harefield.

THE KENT SNOWFLAKES. The Snowflakes are a group of twenty students between the ages of 12 and 15, who come from the Medway Towns. They have been practising together for 12 months and have performed at several Carnivals during the year. Their costumes were provided by the girls who ran jumble sales and discos to raise the money. Their leader is Barbara Griffin, and the group is sponsored by the Kent County Council Youth Movement.
