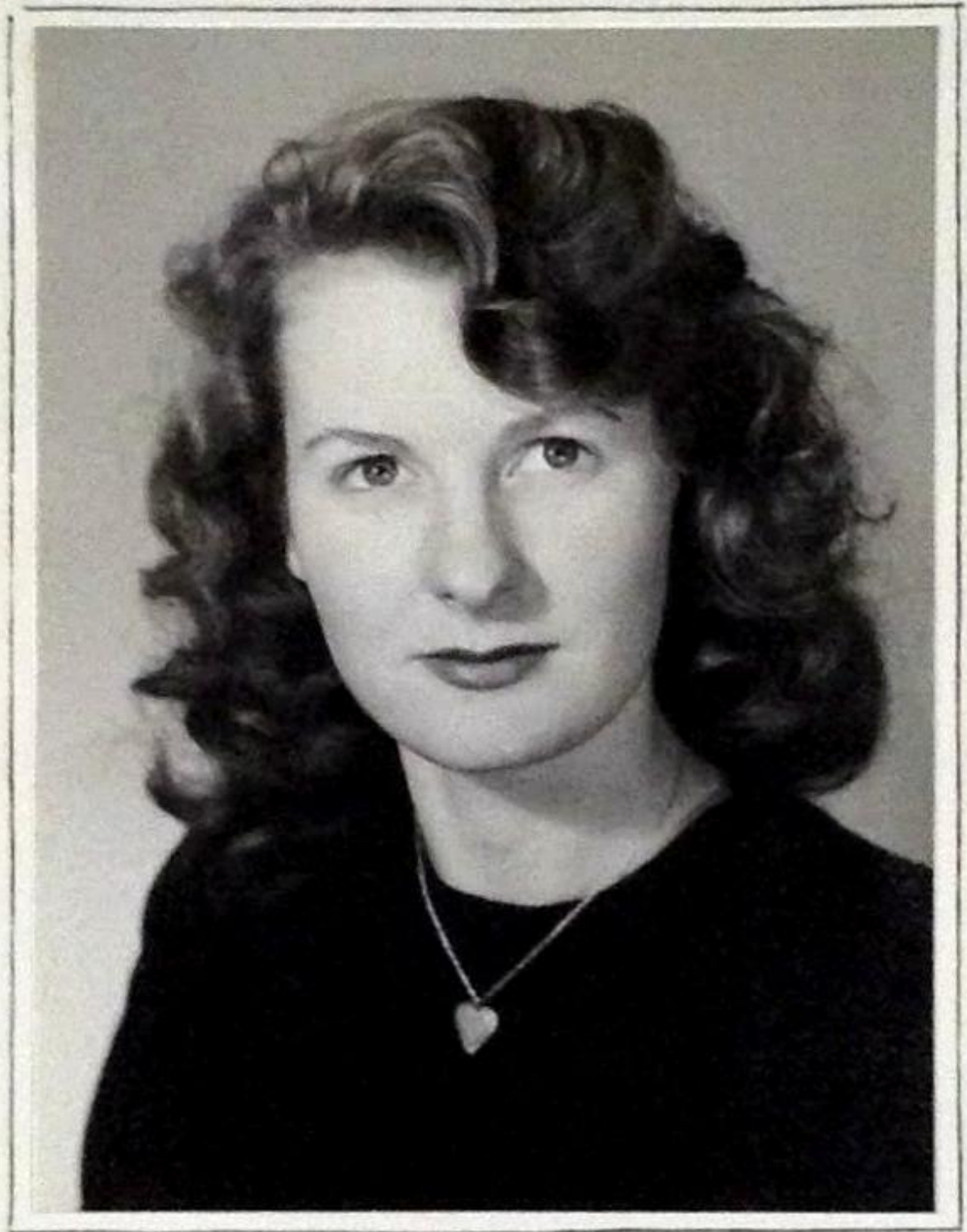

Queen writes to girl about her grannie

THE QUEEN'S good wishes to Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Barnett Drussel, of 20, Denziloe-avenue, Hillingdon, arrived on Tuesday, two days after their golden wedding anniversary.

The Queen does not usually send messages of congratulations to anything less than diamond anniversaries, but this time the message came in a friendly letter written by a lady-in-waiting to 12-year-old Elaine Patrickson, of Charville-lane West, the couple's youngest granddaughter.

Elaine sent off a letter to the Queen without consulting anybody, addressing it simply to "The Queen, Buckingham Palace." She told "Dear Madam" about the golden wedding anniversary on November 11, and added: "They have been very happy all their married life. I love them very much."

Back came the reply from Buckingham Palace, explaining the message rule, and adding that the Queen was "most interested to hear of Mr. and Mrs. Drussel, and when you next see them Her Majesty would be pleased if you would tell them that the Queen wishes them well, and Her Majesty hopes that they spend a very happy day on the 11th November."

HAPPY DAY

Mr. and Mrs. Drussel did indeed spend a happy day on the 11th. They received cards, flowers and gifts from friends and their family, and in the

afternoon went to tea with their married daughter and grandchildren.

They were married at St. Peter's Church, Paddington, in 1912, and walked to their wedding because they could not afford to do otherwise. Their total cash assets that day were £4 10s, 30s belonging to Mr. Drussel, an insurance agent, and £3 to the 20-year-old bride, Miss Christina Patrickson.

WAR SERVICE

Mr. Drussel served with the R.A.O.C. in France from 1915 until the end of the war, and then went into the Civil Service. He was with the Air Ministry, and later spent the last nine years before retirement eight years ago with the A.I.D. at Harefield. They have lived at Hillingdon for 30 years.

They lost one of their sons when he was shot down off the coast of Holland during the last world war, but still have two daughters and a son, and five grandchildren.

The whole family has always been closely connected with the scouting and guide movements. Mrs. Drussel is an active member of the Ickenham Spiritualist Church, and Mr. Drussel is secretary of the Greenwood Bowmen, of Southall.
