Editorial

Looking ahead to 2022, I am mindful that, in February, it will be the Queens Platinum anniversary (that's 70 years) since she ascended the throne. I wondered whether I could find anything in the archives vaguely relevant on which I could use as an excuse for mentioning this fact. And low and behold, I came across a the document shown here.

It is a program for "**Harefield Coronation Celebrations**". Perfect (or so I thought). On the front is exalts "Harefield Residents '*Decorate your Houses*".

However, when I turned the page, I was surprised to discover that this document is for an earlier coronation, that of her majesty's father, King George VI. In fact, it makes quite amusing reading so I decided to put it in the newsletter anyway.

The coronation was on May 12th 1937 and the celebrations in Harefield continued for three days. Items that caught my attention amongst the sporting events is the Bun and Treacle Fight and the gift of a Golden Sovereign for the first baby born on Coronation Day.
