Visit to Manor Farm Museum near Witney in Oxfordshire. A museum of farming and rural life in the Edwardian period, it includes farmyard displays,
farm animals and an historical trail.

In the afternoon we take you to Littlecote House near Hungerford in Berkshire. We shall enjoy a guided tour of this Manor House followed by a tour of the Roman Villa. Our visit to Littlecote House is timed to see the gardens at their best.
